


# Mother Mabel Fernandez Anthony

# Obituary

**Mable Anthony** was born on January 25, 1930, in Harlem, NY. Mable met her Boaz at the age of 8, through a fight between her brother Herbie and her late husband, affectionately known as Bobby. He was the love of her life. They lovingly raised 8 children along with raising 3 generations of grandchildren. While raising a large family, she decided to pursue her dream career as a beautician, and then later transitioned to work for the New York Board of Education, as a paraprofessional. While supporting and instructing children with the fundamentals of education, she also became an advisor to the many teachers and faculty that worked with her. They often sought her advice and wisdom.

In the early 60's, Mable became a devoted Christian. She followed the leadership of Pastor B. Webb, Fairview Holiness Church in Harlem, NY. Mother Mable was a passionate Christian, she decided to utilize her children and later created a choir that soon became a household name. She was known as the Mother of the Church.

Mother Mable then joined St. Peter's Church located in the Bronx, in the late 70's. There she faithfully worshipped God, while serving under the tutelage of Bishop T.B. Jackson and his wife, affectionately known as "Mother Jack". After their transition, she ministered under the leadership of her daughter, Pastor Shante D. Edgehill.

Mable was born with the wisdom of Solomon, she was often asked by the young and the old to provide sound advice. Along with that she was a woman of her word, known as a "straight shooter." Known to speak "nothing but the truth," she did not gossip or slander other people's character. Instead, she encouraged and uplifted others. Most importantly she was a giver.

Mother Mable was a loving and kind hearted woman. She always displayed acts of kindness, not only to those she knew, but strangers as well. During The Great Migration, she showed kind gestures and supported her family by opening her home to them. For example, when her family moved from the South to New York City, she helped them embark on their journeys to start a new life with their families.

Mother Mable was devoted to God. She had anointed praise in her mouth and on her tongue. Every Sunday, she had a song in her heart and a testimony that changed and transformed lives. When Mable walked into the church, everyone knew she was there. She was admired and known all over the church for her iconic fashion: matching outfits with shoes, dresses, and custom jewelry, and especially for her famous hats with matching wigs. Every Sunday morning before church and during the week, she would flood her home singing songs of praise, "it's in my heart, this melody of God's love divine" or "Amazing Grace" to her children.

To her children, she was always their confidant, and always there for them without judgement. They viewed her as the real thing. Even as adults her children could always find a warm spot on her bed to chat authentically with her about anything going on in their lives.

To her grandchildren, she was a woman of wisdom, courage, and always inspired them to be great. She was present for almost all of their accomplishments: graduations, weddings, and birthdays. She always wanted them to know what she knew, so they could do better. She made each and everyone of them feel as if they could be the president of the United States, with her uplifting words and support. She would often end a conversation with them, by sliding them a few dollars, even if she didn't have it. Mother Mable was a true
