Obituary

Daphne Mae Staff was born on October 19, 1927 to Sara Taylor and Emil Johnson in Banks District, Vere Clarendon, Jamaica. She was the 3rd child of 8 children and the first daughter. After completing her primary school education, Daphne went to trade school and became a professional seamstress. Daphne enjoyed a 43-year long career as an excellent seamstress, known for making expertly tailored men's suits, women's formal wear and she was a young entrepreneur, owner of her own dress shop in Clarendon.

Daphne married Keith Staff on December 30, 1956 and together they raised 3 children, Audrey, Trevor, and Evette. Daphne emigrated to England in 1959 and ultimately to the United States in 1981. Daphne was diagnosed with a brain tumor in 1987. She faced this challenge with faith and determination and her family is grateful they were blessed with an additional 32 years to create many more memories.

Daphne, "Aunt Sweety" as she was affectionately called by her friends and family, was known for her quick wit, playful nature, and compassionate heart. Her passion was people. She was an adopted grandmother and aunt to many. She loved conversation and fondly cared about knowing who you were and how she could help you if needed. "Aunt Sweety" loved to make people laugh. She could tell the best jokes - without effort, loved to playfully tickle (which she often like to do to her grown son), and she was never shy about giving a joke on herself. Daphne enjoyed watching game shows, and often enthusiastically participated from her armchair at the head of the dinning room table. "Wheel of Fortune", "Jeopardy", and "The Price is Right" were her favorites.

Daphne lived a faith-filled life. She was baptized and accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior as a young woman, and reconfirmed as a born-again believer, proclaiming Jesus as Lord of her life while having a conversation with her son about 5 years ago about her faith.

On Friday, October 11, 2019, Daphne Mae Staff, loving mother of three, grandmother of four, and great-grandmother of three, entered eternal life at the age of 91.

Daphne is preceded in death by her father, Emil, her mother, Sara, 6 siblings – Vernal, Alvin, Errol, John, Eric, and Hilma, and her eldest daughter, Audrey. She is survived by her husband, Keith; two sisters, Cislyn Senior and Ruby Johnson; two children, Trevor and Evette; one daughter-in-law, Deborah; four grandchildren, Angelica Louissant (husband, Abner Louissant, Jr.), Kristen Daley (husband, Alvin Daley), Merrick Staff, and Trey-Michael Reid; three great-grand children, Abigail Louissant, Noah and Emanuella Daley, and a host of nieces, nephews, friends, and family, too many to list, but not forgotten.
