Although they lived in the projects, Jean and Kevin never thought of themselves as poor. Their mother went to work every day at the North Jersey Training School, later renamed the North Jersey Developmental Center located in Totowa, New Jersey. She worked there for over 20 years before she retired as a supervisor.

Working at North Jersey, allowed her to take her children Jean and Kevin to many day trips such as to the New York City's Radio City Music Hall, Palisades Park Amusement Park, Pennsylvania Dutch Country and Circle Line Cruises. Of course, during the summer, Jean and Kevin were shipped off to South Carolina to spend the summer with Uncle Jacob and Aunt Stina or they were dropped off in Newark at either Aunt Lue or Aunt Marie's house.

While at North Jersey, Gladys McDuffie was also able to meet some lifelong friends such as Joann McRae and Hattie White. These two women along with Vera Wigfall, Helen Bacote and Aunt Shirley were true friends. They were always there to share in the good times and to help her through any problems that arose.

After retiring from North Jersey, Gladys McDuffie moved to the Norman Cotton Senior Citizen Home located at 163 Rosa Parks Blvd. in Paterson. She lived there until a few years ago when her son Kevin finally made the decision that she could no longer live by herself and he moved her in with him, his wife Escha and their children.

Since Kevin was a member of another church, he'd often try to get her to go to church with him on Sundays. She would go sometimes, but most of the time she declined. She reminded him that she had her own church home and that was Christ Temple Baptist Church, located at 38 Hopper Street in Paterson, New Jersey. She would remind him that she had been a member of Christ Temple for well over 50 years and they "treated her royally". She often bragged about how well the members of Christ Temple treated her. Whether they put money in a card for her, paid for her ticket to an event, drove her home after an event or came by the house to visit or to help clean up or whatever else they did to make her feel loved and appreciated. She was a member of the church's Pastor's Aide and Golden Hearts. The McDuffie family would like to express a sincere thank you to the members of the Christ Temple Baptist Church for the love they showed Gladys McDuffie while she was still alive to enjoy it.
