

Around 2009, Stacy's life was forever changed when she was contacted on Facebook by someone claiming to be her sibling. In November 2014, Stacy was diagnosed with stage 4 colon cancer and given a prognosis of two years. Stacy was preceded in death by her brother Brian and her parents. She is now resting with her parents. 

