## Obituary

Doris (Vangie) was born to Vernon Carpenter, Sr. and Rebecca Luvenue Carpenter (both deceased) on February 5, 1939 in Pleasant Hill, North Carolina. She was the oldest of seven children from this union. At an early age, Doris joined the Diamond Grove Baptist Church in Skippers, Virginia. She was a faithful member and participated in various youth ministries. Also, she sang in the choir.

After twenty-two years of working for Penn Mutual Life Insurance, she decided to retire in November 2009 as a Supervisor for Customer Service.
