*Mary also known as Ricky, was a life-long Brooklynite who attended the public schools in New York City. After school, she worked various jobs before starting her family.*

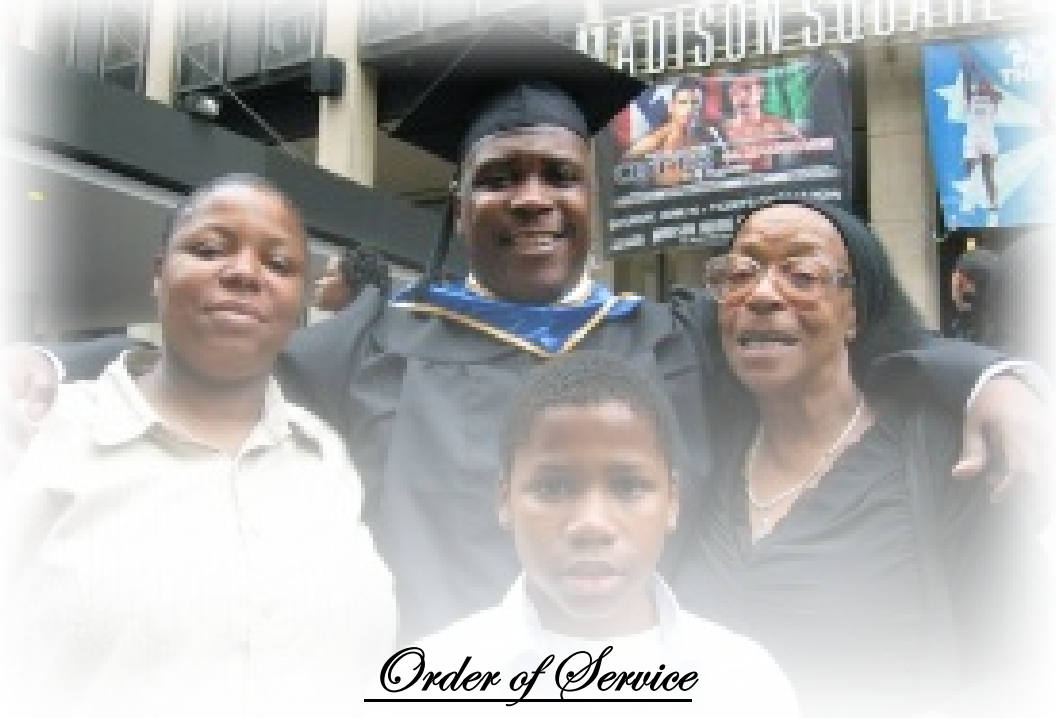
