On Wednesday, October 30, 2019, at about 11:30 a.m. The angel of silence came into Trinitas Regional Medical Center, Elizabeth, New Jersey, and with chilly fingers sealed the lips of our beloved, husband, father, brother, uncle, pastor and friend. **Pastor Lee Vern Morant Sr.** was born on February 23, 1953 in Newark, New Jersey the second oldest child born to the Late Joseph and the Late Eunice Morant. He was educated in the public school system, of Newark, New Jersey and later attended Nyack College, in Nyack, New York. He furthered his education at Seton Hall University, South Orange, New Jersey. He also studied at Fuller Normal Industrial Institute for Evangelism, Greenville, South Carolina. For 27 years he was employed by St. Barnabas Medical Center in Livington, New Jersey.

Pastor Morant received his personal experience from the Lord in 1975, at Mt. Zion Fire Baptized Holiness Church of God of the America, Linden, New Jersey.
