**Alexander Leonard Thornley**, a respected veteran, retired United States Postal Service man, and devoted family patriarch has passed at the age of 92 years old.

Al appreciated the time he spent with his children and shared his numerous passions by teaching them.

Known as an avid player of board games, cards and puzzles, Al would challenge anyone to a match. However, of all his countless hobbies and passions, Al's favorite was music. His joy for music and his soulful singing flowed through his family and was a notable staple in the home. Al sang to his children and grandchildren his favorite Frank Sinatra songs while eating any one of his favorite Haagen-Dazs ice cream flavors. Al was known for having an amazing voice. He could be caught on any given day humming or singing the soothing tunes of Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis, Jr., Barbara Streisand, Ella Fitzgerald, Sara Vaughn, Nancy Wilson, Johnny Mathis, and a host of others.

For those that knew Al, they knew he was a sharp dresser, always clean cut, debonair, and dapper.

Al spent his last days in his hometown of Harlem, NY, at Amsterdam House where he passed away on Monday, November 4, 2019.

He will be remembered and forever loved for his warm demeanor and kind heart, and will be deeply missed by his family, friends, and all that knew him.
