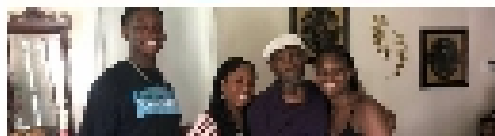
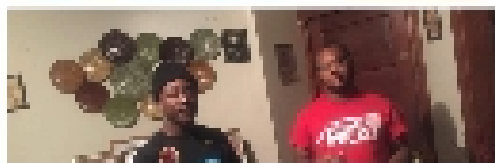
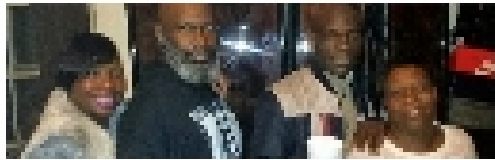
Theodore worked in the Produce Industry for over 40 years as a Truck Driver until he retired.

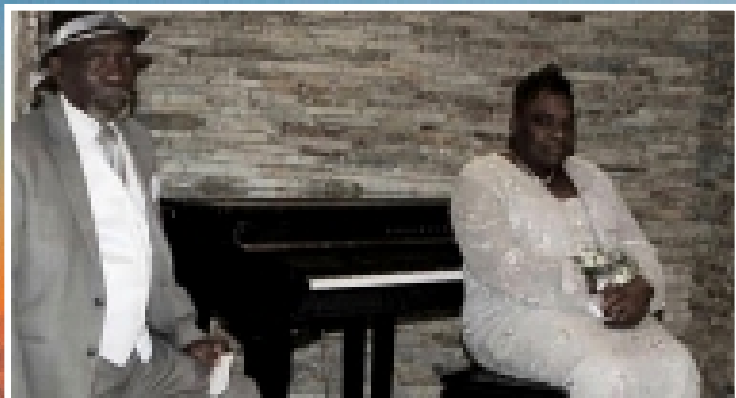
