Lawrence departed this life on Friday, November 29, 2019 at Beth Israel Hospital in Newark, NJ. Keon attended George Washington Carver & Hawthorne Avenue Elementary School both of Newark, NJ. He graduated from middle school in June of 2002. Keon then attended Weequahic High School of Newark, NJ from 2002-2006. Keon played on the Boys Varsity Basketball team all 4 years while attending Weequahic High School under the leadership of Coach Derrick Butler. Keon E. Lawrence is the 1st Newark Public School's Player, 1st leading scorer in Newark, NJ History of Boys Varsity Basketball, the 3rd Player in Essex County History and the 67th Player in New Jersey's History to make over 2,000 points in his High School Career. Keon also attended Alif Muhammad Nia School from 2003-2006 where he received his High School diploma in June of 2006. Keon was nominated to the McDonald's All American High School Basketball Team following his high school graduation. Keon played in the Newark Public Schools Holiday Basketball Tournament for the All-Tournament Team in 2004 & 2005. Keon played in the 28th Annual NJSCA North-South All Star Basketball Classic at the Ritacco Center at Toms River High School and received awards for the Men's Most Valuable Player & Slam Dunk Champion. Keon was inducted into the Men of Essex Hall of Fame & the Newark Athletic Hall of Fame for Athlete of the Year in 2006. Keon also played for the U.S. Army National High School All-Star Basketball Game and received a plague for Most Valuable Player.

Keon then committed to Missouri University and played for the Mizzou Men's Basketball Team from 2006-2008 under the leadership of Coaches Quin Snyder & Melvin Watkins. Keon then went to transfer to Seton Hall University for the Pirates Men's Basketball Team from 2008-2011 under the leadership of Coaches Bobby Gonzalez & Dermon Player. Keon then had his commencement services from Seton Hall University in May 2011 where he received his Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice. Keon then continued on playing more basketball for his usual summer leagues at Branch Brook Park in Newark, NJ; East Orange Campus High School in East Orange, NJ; Baruch College the City University of New York in New York City, NY; Holcombe Rucker Park in New York, NY; the ABA Basketball League; and various other programs for little league basketball for the youth throughout his break during his Basketball Season. Keon then furthered his Basketball Career in the BLNO Basketball League in the EuroBasket Circuit with Tromso Storm from 2014-2019 under the leadership of Coach Kenneth Webb. While in his seasons under Tromso Storm he got awards for Most Valuable Player in the leagues playoffs, multiple articles for Player of the week and Player of the Month, The Gold and Bronze Medal during his Regular Season as well as during his Leagues Playoffs. Keon was inducted in the Newark Athletic Hall of Fame for Weequahic High School on October 26, 2017. Keon before his transition was picked up in the draft and was scheduled to leave overseas this month of December.

Keon had recently started work at UPS in Newark, NJ and truly liked the job he was doing. Keon E. Lawrence was a sweet kind hearted person who loved to dance, sing

karaoke with friends and family and was an all-around standout person. Keon got along with all walks of life from street to the youth to the political. Keon was a mentor to a lot of people especially the youth within his community as well as with the youth organizations internationally. Keon was a phenomenal person who had a gift for basketball who wasn't afraid to share it with his peers, his fans, the youth or his community. Keon shared an unbreakable bond with his mother as a son that no one can compare. There wasn't not one person who didn't love, admire, care, enjoyed and respected being around Keon for all that knew him. Keon was truly a LADIES MEN to all the women he encountered throughout the years. Keon had 3 loves that he cherished dearly and they were His Mom Darlene Epps, His Son Keon E. Lawrence Jr & Basketball. 

Keon Lawrence Weequahic High School

Keon is a 6'2" guard who averages 30.3 points, 9.2 rebounds and 7 assist a game with a 23-2 record for the season. Only playing Varsity for three years, he was the second player to reach 1,000 points with only playing 38 games. Kelly Tripucka scored 1,000 points in 36 games playing in Essex County. Keon was "player of the week" in 2004-05 SY and 2005-06 SY. He recorded 11 triple-doubles and scored 40 points or more six times this season alone. Keon's career high was "51" points against McCarrick H.S. Keon Lawrence is the first Newark Public Schools' player to score 2,000 points for a high school career. He is the 67th player in New Jersey's history to score 2,000 points and the 3rd in Essex County behind Kelly Tripucka and Eric Williams. Keon was nominated to the McDonald's All American High School Basketball Team and he will attend Missouri University this fall.

Keon Lawrence: Motivated By Success By Ted Bryant, Media Relations Student-Assistant

After a stellar freshman year, Keon Lawrence returns as a key player for this year's Missouri Tigers. With a year of playing time under his belt, Lawrence hopes to combine his raw talent with first-hand experience to lead the Tigers back to postseason play.

"This year I'm bringing more scoring to the team, more rebounding, more steals," Lawrence said. "I'm doing a lot more this year, but I think I can get a whole lot better. It's early in the season and I'm glad that whatever mistakes I'm making, coach is getting on me about them while it's still early. That way I can fix them by the time we get into conference play."

As a freshman, Lawrence averaged 9.7 and 2.9 rebounds points per game, and also led the Tigers to a win against conference rival Oklahoma with a game-winning basket last season at Mizzou Arena. His accomplishments led to comparisons to another Missouri great, Kareem Rush.

"It was really good," he said. "He was a great player here, so that showed me that I've got something good going on and that people are taking notice. It's great to be compared to him."

Lawrence is already busy improving the numbers he put up last year. Through eight games, he and Leo Lyons were tied for third in scoring at 11.9 points per game. Lawrence also ranks second on the team in steals, assists, and rebounds, flashing that all-around game he was recruited to bring. The difference this season, however, is that he is doing it against much stiffer competition. The Tigers have started the season playing against high-quality opponents such as Michigan State, Maryland, Arkansas, and Cal.

"It's getting us ready for conference play and getting us ready for games that we know are going to be close in the league," Lawrence said. "We'll know what plays we've got to make to win, so I think it's helping us a lot."

Lawrence spent the summer playing in the renowned New Jersey Shore Summer League, where he played against professional players as well as college standouts.

"It's a semi-pro league," Lawrence said. "Some NBA guys came through there and play. Brevin Knight (Charlotte Bobcats) was there. Randy Foye from the Timberwolves was there. It's good competition every night. You've got to come with it every night and play. You can't be slacking or they will show you up."

Lawrence definitely didn't slack off, as he averaged 29.8 points and finished third in the league in scoring. The summer league he ped him focus on areas of his game that he felt he needed work on, and gave him a chance to take his game to a new level.

"It was fun," he said. "It brought some stuff out in my game that I knew I had, I just didn't know how to bring it out against that level of competition. It also taught me that no matter who I'm playing against. I've got to play hard."

Lawrence has a great opportunity to carry those experiences over this season, combining what he learned over the summer with good team chemistry. The Tigers return a number of familiar faces to the lineup this season, a fact that Lawrence believes can only help the team.

"It's different [this season] because we know more about each other," he said. "Everyone knows what to expect, so that's a big difference. We're used to each other now and know the strengths of each others game."

Lawrence believes the Tigers have shot to make some noise in the Big 12 this year, and that as long as they can play mistake-free basketball, they can play with anybody.

"We're only a couple plays, a couple stops from being undefeated right now and I think you can expect a whole lot from us this year," he said. "This is just the beginning, but we're right there. We are going to put Missouri Basketball back on the national map."






