He was affectionately called Duanie by his parents Julia Mae Carvain and Robert L. Carvain. He entered into their lives on March 23, 1952 in a project in Brooklyn NY. Duane's parents worked very hard and purchased a home in St Albans, NY where their pride and joy, Duane grew up. Very early on everyone could see that Duane was a superstar. He was extremely smart and could play both football and baseball with a fury and skill unmatched. Duane's parents instilled within him a work ethic that became a part of his character and integrity.

His attendance at Brooklyn Tech High School was a grand success. On November 10, 2019 his football team of 1969 was inducted into the Brooklyn Tech Football Hall of Fame. His athletic prowess earned him a full athletic scholarship to Temple University where he honed his skills and dreams to become a professional football player. After his years of working on Wall Street, Duane decided to focus on his athletic capacities. As Manager of Omni Fitness and as a Personal Trainer he helped many athletes and entertainers reach their athletic goals and aspirations.

Duane was an astute businessman. At the age of 25 he was a Partner of the Iconic Top Shelf Productions which promoted parties at Marque & Marquee East during the Disco era. He and his partners were the Toast of the Town. He was the Co-Owner of the Award Winning New York milkshake Company that served the best milkshakes and grilled cheese sandwiches out of it's four locations throughout Manhattan. As an international business man, he served as the Account Executive for Nigerian Imports & Exports. The Nigerian Governor, Lucky Igbinedion befriended Duane. This relationship afforded Duane the opportunity to travel and do business in Amsterdam and London. He lived in Nigeria for 3 months. This experience exposed him to the life of the very rich and famous.

Every business and position that Duane held, he executed an impeccable work ethic. His knack for upgrading systems made him an invaluable asset wherever he worked. If you had the pleasure of knowing Duane, you would know that he was a very passionate man. He loved, took care of and protected his family. He was always the hardest worker in the room. He was meticulous about time and money. Even though he was always about his business, he had an amazing sense humor. He was a man that wanted more and better for everyone. Whether he used humor to lighten the mood or a pep talk to boost a person's confidence, he was everyone's "Go To Person". His Temple Hat was his signature trademark.

On November 1, 2019 Duane married the love of his life Yvette V. Miller who he affectionately called Cia. His goal was to love her, protect her and partner with her as they journeyed together through this life. In his wedding vows he wrote and promised "I will love you til death do us part and even then you will always be in my heart." When Duane's daughter Danielle K. Carvain was born she captivated his heart. He adored and loved her dearly. He considered her one his greatest achievement and contribution to this world. They shared the same taste in music and movies. Their personalities synced as did their sense of humor.

Duane was preceded in death by his Mother, Julia Mae Carvain and Father, Robert L. Carvain.
