Jewel Coleman-Harris was born on April 14, 1946 in

Dawson, Georgia. She was the daughter of the late West Coleman, Sr. and Bertha Peters Coleman. When Jewel was just four years old, the family moved to New Jersey in 1950. She was educated in the Elizabeth Public School system and graduated from Edison High School, now known as Elizabeth High School in Elizabeth. At an early age, Jewel joined Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church in Roselle. She took some college courses and received certificates in Child Education and Development.

Jewel married James Adam Harris in 1969. With this union, they were blessed with five children and four step-children. Her career path began with Singer Sewing Machine Factory in Elizabeth in the 1970's, followed by ICC Daycare. Once she and her husband decided to move to Willingboro, New Jersey, Jewel used her talents and experience at the Willingboro Board of Education. She remained there for the rest of her working years in an effort to be closer to her grandchildren and great-grandchildren who attended during their school aged years.

When she settled in south New Jersey, she became the Mother of Abundant Life Ministries at 49 N. Hermitage Avenue in Trenton. She also enjoyed spending time visiting her sisters' houses of worship as well, no matter where it may have been. She loved taking bus rides with her sisters and nieces to Atlantic City and dancing with her grandchildren to "Lean with it, Rock with it" or "Follow Me" by Aly us. She was the fun Aunt who could always hang with the younger crowd without judgment, and only to add smiles and laughter.

She loved the sounds of Mahalia Jackson, Snoop Dogg, The Temptations and Michael Jackson. Her favorite movie was any movie that starred Leon Robinson or a full African American cast. The thing she enjoyed doing the most was laughing, and the thing she did the best was not worry. Jewel's favorite quotes were "Money Cometh," "Have that baby and bring it to me" and "It'll all work itself out." The word "wise" does no justice to explaining the amount of knowledge she held and spread to all of those she raised. On Thursday, December 12, 2019, Jewel Coleman-Harris departed this earthly life.

Jewel was predeceased by her son, Darnell Harris; granddaughter, Yolanda Lashawn "Poodah" Harris; and 5 sisters: Henrietta Johnson, Beulah Harden, Mary Coleman, Analee Brown and Minnie B. Clark.
