

OBITUARY

Calvin L. Donaldson was born September 3, 1941, in Orange, NJ, to the late Theodore and Emma Donaldson. After a long cruel illness he was released from his suffering on December 29, 2019.

Calvin grew up in Newark, NJ. He was educated in Newark's school system and graduated from Central High School in 1959. After completing his education, he was enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1966 during the Vietnam conflict. Upon completion, he received an honorable discharge. In 1967, he gained employment with the United States Postal Service. He received many awards for being a dedicated, outstanding employee. He retired from the post office in 2002.

In 1968, he met Fannie L. Jackson and on December 27, 1976 they were united in holy matrimony. They resided in Plainfield, NJ for 36 years where they raised their children.
