Above all, Kevin was a family man. He was very proud of his children. Kevin always encouraged the family to get together even when he was busy. Kevin always had a smile on his face; even when he may have had a bad day. When having a conversation with Kevin, he made sure to leave you with a positive mindset. He will be sorely missed by all who knew and loved him.
