Obituary

Frederick McCall was born November 5, 1935 in Brooklyn, New York. He was the first son of the Late Deacon Madison McCall and the Late Mother Willie Ozelia Syndor McCall. He was preceded in death by his brother, James McCall and sister, Mary Lena McCall Williams.

Freddy completed his education through the public-school system, where he attended Junior High School 35. Freddy graduated from Murry Hill Vocational High School in New York City. He was inducted in the U.S. Army in 1958 and served three years as a Chaplin's Assistant. He returned home and worked in the neighborhood butcher store named "Louie"; Freddy later became the owner for over twenty years.

Freddy decided to change his profession and was hired by Ideal Corp as a Security Supervisor until they moved from New York. After which Rainbow Apparel bought the property at 100 Pennsylvania Avenue and retained him as their Security Officer. Freddy worked at Rainbow until he retired in 2015.

Freddy was a member of the Brooklyn Federation of Black Cowboys for over thirty years and owned his own horse named Hondo. The federation provided hayrides throughout Brooklyn, Queens and the Bronx. In addition, the Brooklyn Federation of Black Cowboys marched in the Thanksgiving Parade. His close friends BFBC were Zeke, Rock McCloud and Jimmy Parker.

In 1957, Frederick met Doris Barton from Muncie Indiana; they were married on June 27, 1959 by the late Bishop F.D. Washington and the Late Bishop Frank Clemmons in Washington Temple COGIC.

While under the leadership of the late Bishop Frank Clemmons, Freddy served in the Glee Club, was part of the Sunshine Band, and the Engineers Team for the Sunday Night Evening Broadcast which led him to work with other churches.

Frederick leaves to cherish his memories: his beloved and devoted wife of 62 years, Doris of Howard Beach, New York; one son, Kevin McCall of Howard Beach, New York; one sister, Margaret McCall-Younge of Newark, Delaware; one brother, Frank (Gloria) McCall of Kenly, North Carolina; five sisters-in-love, two brothers-in-love, one grandson, Kevin; two granddaughters, Destiny and Brianna; one great granddaughter, Mercedes; a host of cousins, nieces, nephews, co-workers and friends.
