Almeta Fant was born August 06, 1946 to Mary Louise Smith and William Howard Fant; she was the eldest of six children. She attended St. Matthews Elementary in Camden, South Carolina and raised on her grandparents Mary and Willie Smith's farm until her family moved to Newark, New Jersey in 1959 where subsequently, she and the family became members of Trinity U.A.M.E. Church.

She accepted Jesus Christ to be her Lord and Savior at an early age and has served faithfully.

After graduating from Central High School in 1964, she was accepted at Martland Hospital School of Nursing. Then after completing surgical nursing training she continued to work for the hospital for 7 years. She then attended Upsala College and majored in social work.

After the riots in 1967, she was offered many opportunities with the city of Newark, where she worked for the next 30 years training people through Comprehensive Employment Development Services. One of which was the S.Y.E.T.P (Summer Youth Employee Training Program) under the Gibson era. Through this program she assisted in developing satellite Community Health Centers to provide health care projects to accommodate the homeless population of Newark where she opened 5 women shelters, 8 men shelters and 2 co-ed shelters for homeless single families.

During the 1980's, she was the coordinator for the late Kenneth A. Gibson's campaign for Mayor. She continued to work for the city of Newark until retirement in 1993.

Coming out of retirement in 1995, she went to sales as a new career. She was a successful automobile certified sales consultant for Daimler Chrysler Corporation and Volkswagen Academy (H&D Linden Automart). At her retirement in 2006, she received numerous awards and the highest recognition for certification and sales.

Despite her busy life, Almeta held many offices at Trinity, one being a Trustee. After serving as a trustee, she was appointed to the steward board as the pastor steward by the now Bishop Adolphus Scott, Jr. She also was given the charge to start a 6 a.m. prayer ministry, which was successfully implemented for over 20 years. At this time, she took ETA classes to help with the responsibility of her appointment as the pastor steward and she continued to serve on the steward board while mentoring and encouraging her brother-in-law, Michael Morris to become the next pastor steward.

Almeta encouraged her siblings how to give to the homeless and the community even to all who were less fortunate. She held jobs at Bristol-Meyers, she was a forensic photographer for the Newark Police Department, and she worked in the emergency room at Irvington Hospital.

Almeta was always giving, loving and willing to give her last to support whomever she came in contact with. She had a great sense of humor and loved to dance....Almeta style. She enjoyed teaching culture, etiquette and good sense to her nieces and nephews of whom which she helped to raise. She was a fantastic cook and loved to eat, chat and take adventures.

Almeta was very popular and gave a special piece of herself to everyone she came into contact with. She was very vibrant, strong and full of life and always showing the love of Christ in every situation. She relished in being supportive to her family and friends no matter what it took.

Almeta had a great love for her church and enjoyed taking trips with the church and attending any event she could get to, especially to fellowship with other unionites from across the districts.

Almeta had a special love for her Bishop Adolphus Scott, Jr., whom she always prayed for. Special ministerial friends such as Rev. Maggie Howard, Rev. Mattie Council and Rev. Joseph Bash she looked forward to speaking to and many others; she adored the conference and her church.

On Thursday evening, January 09, 2020, our merciful God allowed her to suffer no more and called her to her up to Him.
