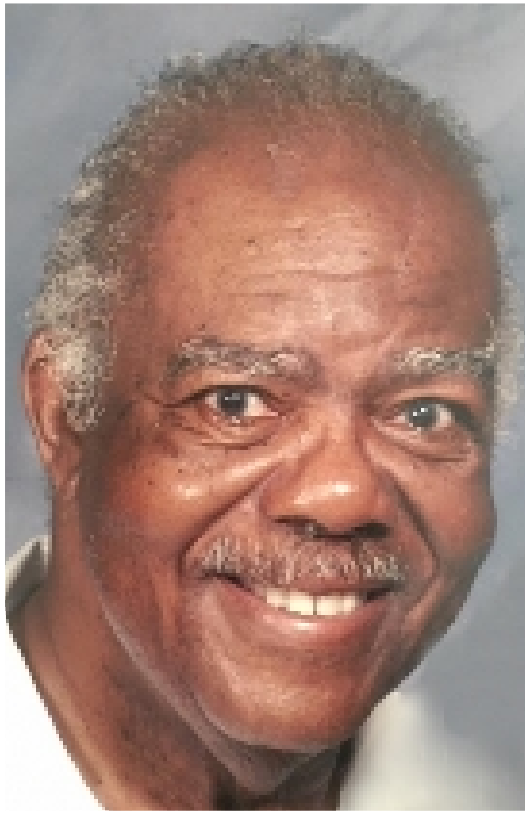

## Obituary

**Frank Richard Moore** was born on Thursday, June 21, 1928 in New Orleans, Louisiana to Loretta Moore nee Wellington and James Sinclair Moore. Frank was a smart, attentive and obedient child. He was an athletic young man who ran track and field and played high school football. He was also a boxer, even having a professional fight at age 20 in New York City.

In his beloved New Orleans, Frank attended Booker T. Washington High School and went to Southern University on a football scholarship. During the Korean War, Frank was drafted into the army and served in France, a country he loved for the remainder of his life. By this time, Frank had met the love of his life, a little lady also from New Orleans, Fabiola Cleo Wilson. Frank and Cleo began a lifelong romance. While Frank was in the military, Cleo went to New York to pave the way for their future. When Frank returned, he joined Cleo in New York. They married and built a family remaining in New York City for over 65 years, both in Brooklyn and in Queens.

After working at a clothing factory, Frank joined the New York City Police Department. He was a conscientious police officer in the Department for 20 years. He said he had to draw his gun but never fired it. Throughout his years as an officer he demonstrated respect and decency for the people in the communities in which he worked, attributes that were hallmarks of his character.

Frank set a high standard for himself, his family and his community. He was fiercely loyal in his friendships and was responsible in every task he undertook. For these reasons and more, Frank was greatly admired by many.

Frank was preceded in death by his parents, his younger brother James Moore, his son in law Andrew Jurinko and his cat Willie. He is survived by his loving wife Fabiola Cleo Moore, daughters, Patricia Loretta Moore and Antoinette Denise Moore, son in law Michael Linus Flores and grandson Kwame Moore Flores, and countless friends.


