Life Reflections

Palricia Brantley Woodson was born on October 6, 1927 in Newark, New Jersey to Everett G. Brantley and Rachel Brantley (nee Cyrus). When she was very young, the family relocated to Cranford, New Jersey. Patricia attended Cranford Public Schools where she was an active student and served as a Captain of the basketball team.

After graduating from Cranford High School, Patricia attended Howard University in Washington, DC. Patricia later received her Bachelor's degree from Newark State College (now Kean University) in Union, New Jersey. She completed her student teaching requirements with the Cranford Board of Education and became the first full-time African-American Teacher for Cranford Public Schools. Patricia spent the majority of her 30-year career as a First Grade School Teacher at the Hillside Avenue School in Cranford.

She and her former husband, the late Douglass N. Woodson, Sr. lovingly reared two children, Douglas, Jr., and Kimberly M. They were the light of her life.

Patricia was raised as a member of St. Marks A.M.E. Church in Cranford and was active until relocating to Pennsylvania.

She was also a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Beta Alpha Omega Chapter and the Cranford College Woman's Club. Patricia was passionate about cooking and loved to watch cooking TV shows featuring the great French Chef Julia Child. She loved to play cards, especially Bridge and often hosted these gatherings with friends in her home.

After retirement, Patricia enjoyed traveling with her daughter Kim across country and throughout Europe, Japan and the Caribbean Islands. Patricia also loved sports cars and perhaps one of her biggest regrets was not buying that split-top Stingray she coveted so much.

On Tuesday, January 21, 2020, Patricia Brantley Woodson departed this life in Easton, Pennsylvania.

She was preceded in death by her parents: Everett and Rachel Brantley; son, Douglas "Chip" Woodson; brother, Morris A. Brantley and nephew, Mark Brantley.
