Celebration of Love, Faith & Dedication

Charlotte Dorethea Boyd Cade was born in Knoxville, TN to Charles and Dorothy Boyd (Blue). She departed this life on January 24, 2020 at her home in Bloomfield, NJ following a period of hospitalization.

Charlotte accepted Christ at 12 years of age and was a faithful and devoted member of the East Vine Avenue Presbyterian Church (now Emmanuel Presbyterian Church) where she participated, very actively, in many programs of the church.

An honor student at Austin High School, she began her undergraduate studies at Johnson C. Smith University, Charlotte, NC, cum laude, where she earned, with honors, a Bachelor of Arts Degree in music education with a minor in English. She served as accompanist for the University Choir, an instructor in piano and was the first underclass student permitted to serve as organist of a church in the city of Charlotte. She received a Master's degree in music education from Montclair State University in Upper Montclair, NJ.

She began her professional career as a music consultant in the Mecklenburg County School System in Charlotte and during this time, she continued her duties as church organist. In June, 1960 she was married to Rev. Henry Cade and to this union was born their daughter, Charyn Henrice. Her first teaching assignment was at Cook High School in Athens, TN. The family moved to Newark, NJ in 1965 and she resumed her teaching career first in Newark, NJ and then in Elizabeth, NJ. She taught piano and vocal music in a school for gifted and talented students. One of the highlights of her career occurred when thirty of her students were selected to perform on. Broadway in two musicals, "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (1993-94) and "A Christmas Carol" (1994-95). Upon retirement, she and her very close friend, Genevieve Hardy, found time to tutor at Clinton Avenue Elementary School in Newark. She was a highly skilled musician and was committed to the task of producing a disciplined, high quality of music at Central Presbyterian Church, Newark, where she served as organist/choir director for the Chancel and Youth Choirs. Her love for music inspired all who had the privilege of working with her.

Many people have assumed the role of service but not all of them have exhibited dedication. Charlotte answered her call and maintained a sincere concern and devotion by spending many hours of unselfish service to others. She was instrumental in perpetuating the cause of Presbyterian Women, locally, regionally and nationally, and encouraged women to become involved in the work of the church by practicing what she, herself, was preaching. She promptly and gladly answered many requests for advice and assistance and received numerous awards along the way. At her church, Bloomfield Church on the Green (Bloomfield., NJ), she was involved in the Naomi Circle (a monthly Bible Study Group), Feed the World, Triplets (prayer partners) the Thrift Store and Women's Fellowship. Last year she received an Honorary Life Membership from Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Charlotte was a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. where she held a membership for 64 years. A member of the Beta Alpha Omega Chapter for over 30 years, she organized the BAQ Chorale which provided music at local and regional meetings and activities.
