Andrew possessed an inner strength that was relatively unmatched because despite how much pain he was in or what he was going through he would normally have a smile on his face because he knew he could deal with it. He never really wanted anybody to worry about him because of that reason. That kind of strength and fortitude can only come from the good Lord.
