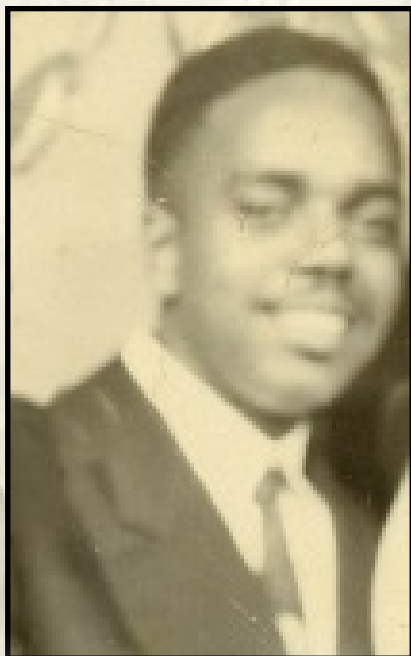

Life Reflections

George Dallis was born on November 4, 1927 in Chipley (now LaGrange), Georgia. He was the third child of the late Willie Virgil Dallis and Armelia Davenport Dallis. George had six siblings: Rose Mae Gates, Lillian Morgan, and the late Erma Dallis, John H. Dallis, Virgil Kate McCollough and Armelia McClendon.

In the early 1950s, George married the late Alice Robertson Dallis in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. They relocated to Atlanta, Georgia and later moved to Brooklyn, New York where their daughter Cecilia was born.

George was employed as a Longshoreman for The International Union of Operating Engineers Local 25 Marine Division.

Back in the day when he was running with his brothers-in-law: Jerome "Jay-Bird" Robertson, William "Cigar" Robertson (pronounced Ceee-Gar) and Willie "Judie" Mackins, and George was known as "Sugar Tit" or "Tit." With names like those, you know they were gangsters!

George's favorite pastime was watching baseball and even boasted that he once played in the Negro League with the Atlanta Black Crackers. In his younger years, he was a sharp and his outfits were dresser; embellished with his favorite hat a Stetson. He was known on the block for always looking out of the window and greeting all of the residents of Hull Street and making sure that 68 & 68A were clean and safe for more than 40 years.

On Friday, February 7, 2020, he departed this earthly life in Brooklyn, New York.

He was predeceased by his sons: Eugene Hicks and Vent Hicks; and granddaughter: Yvonne Williams.

George leaves to cherish fond memories, his two loving daughters: Cecilia Dallis Ricks and Georgeretta Williams (Larry); son: Dock Robert Hicks; five grandchildren: Naima Kai Ricks, William Dallis Ricks, Shamika Williams, Lavelle Williams and Lawrence Williams; nine great-grandchildren; and a host of nieces and nephews including his favorites: Carolyn, Diane and a very special niece, Aiyana who referred to him as "Grandpa" and prepared meals especially for him on his birthdays and holidays.
