

Vera Louise Shaw, commonly known as Aunt Vera was born to Miriam James and Henry Tulloch on January 4th, 1923 in St. Mary Jamaica, W.I. She attended Carron-Hall All-age School.

Vera resided in the parish of St. Mary where she met and married her husband Ephraim Shaw. From that union they produced eight children. In February of 1955, Ephraim transitioned from this life leaving Vera as the sole provider for their children. Several years later she met Aston Davis and they were blessed with six children. In total, she had fourteen children.

With determination and strong faith, she persevered. Vera was well known and loved by her friends, family and all in her community. She lived a wonderful life in Jamaica before immigrating to the United States. She took on various jobs to provide for her children even after the passing of Aston. Vera never got discouraged but continued to pursue her dreams for her and her family.

As the Matriarch of her family Vera loved and served them with passion and purpose. She never ceased to advise and encourage those around her, regardless of their circumstances and she did this with a gentle smile.

On February 1st, 2020, Vera departed from this life. She was called home to be with the Lord; she was ninety-seven years old.

Vera died leaving eleven children, grandchildren, greatgrandchildren, and great-great grandchildren. Three sisters, four brothers and other relatives and friends.

Often when death has taken our loved ones, Leaving our home so lone and so drear, Then do we wonder why others prosper, Living so wicked year after year [Refrain].



Thou must save, and Thou alone.




While I draw this fleeting breath,
