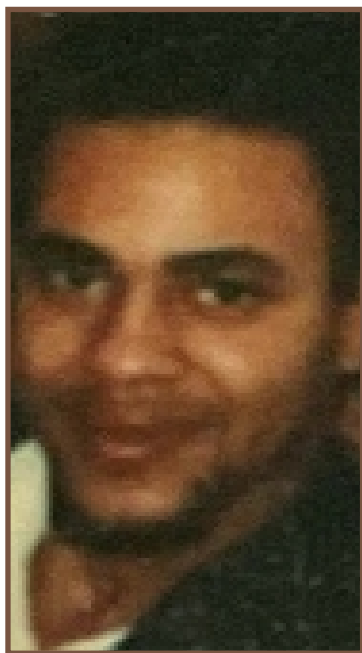

Seymour Leon Solomon was born on June 18, 1951 in Elizabeth, New Jersey to the late Ernest and Rozena Solomon. As a junior in Jefferson High School, he attended Cornell University to study Advanced Mathematics. Seymour was a member of the Organization for Black Liberation (OBL) which in high school he was instrumental for the inclusion of Black Studies. In 1973, he graduated from Cornell University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics.

He was employed as a Buyer for Sears Roebuck in New York for five years from 1973 - 1978. He later worked for the family business "J & A Exterminating" as General Manager for many years.

Seymour, the oldest of eight children, was an intelligent man who loved his family. He was especially crazy about his granddaughters, Kayla and Tyler.

After a long illness, Seymour Solomon departed this life on Thursday, February 20, 2020 at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital in Rahway.

He was preceded by his brother, James Solomon.

Seymour leaves to cherish his memories, his lovely wife, Edna Davis Solomon of 45 years; the only daughter, Se'pree Solomon Coleman (Christopher); siblings: Felecia Salters of Edison, NJ, Adrienne Gaskin of Montclair, NJ, Sharlene Miles (Kevin) of Edison, NJ, Lori-Lavelle Jones (Rev.
