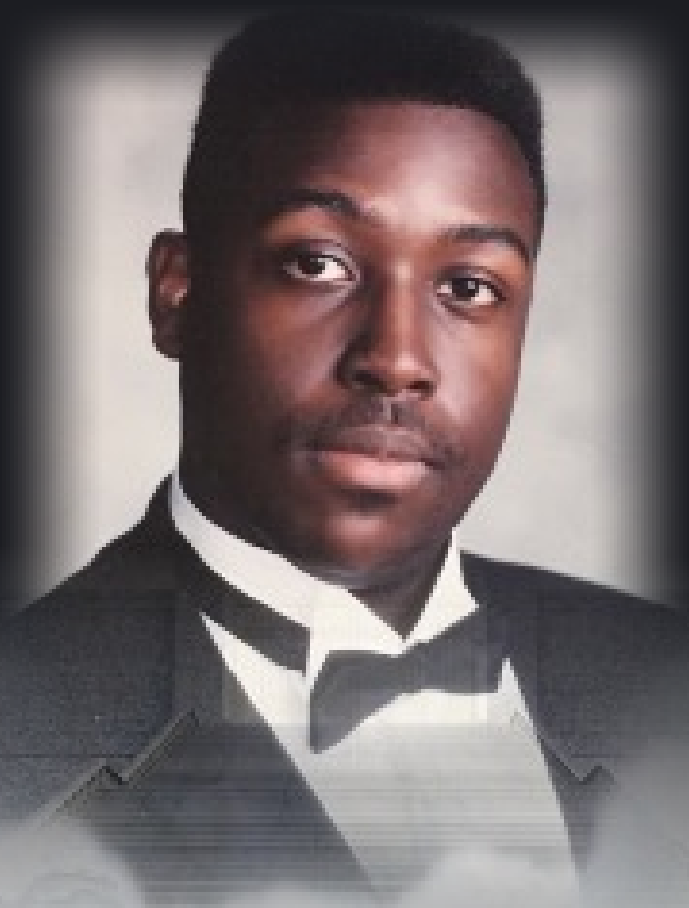

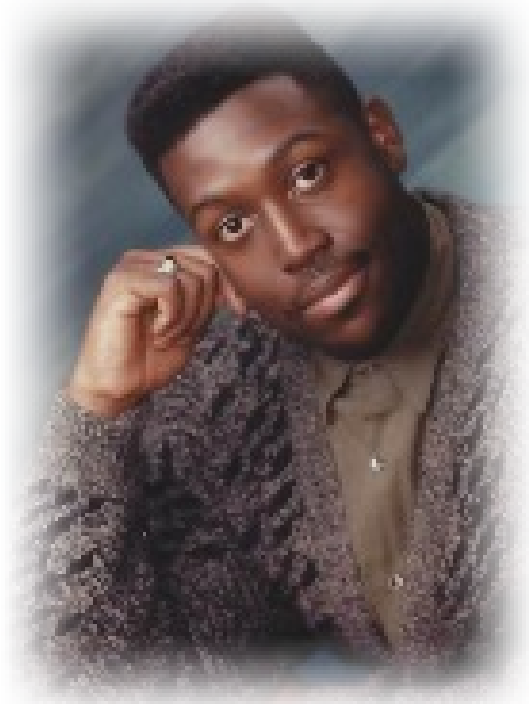

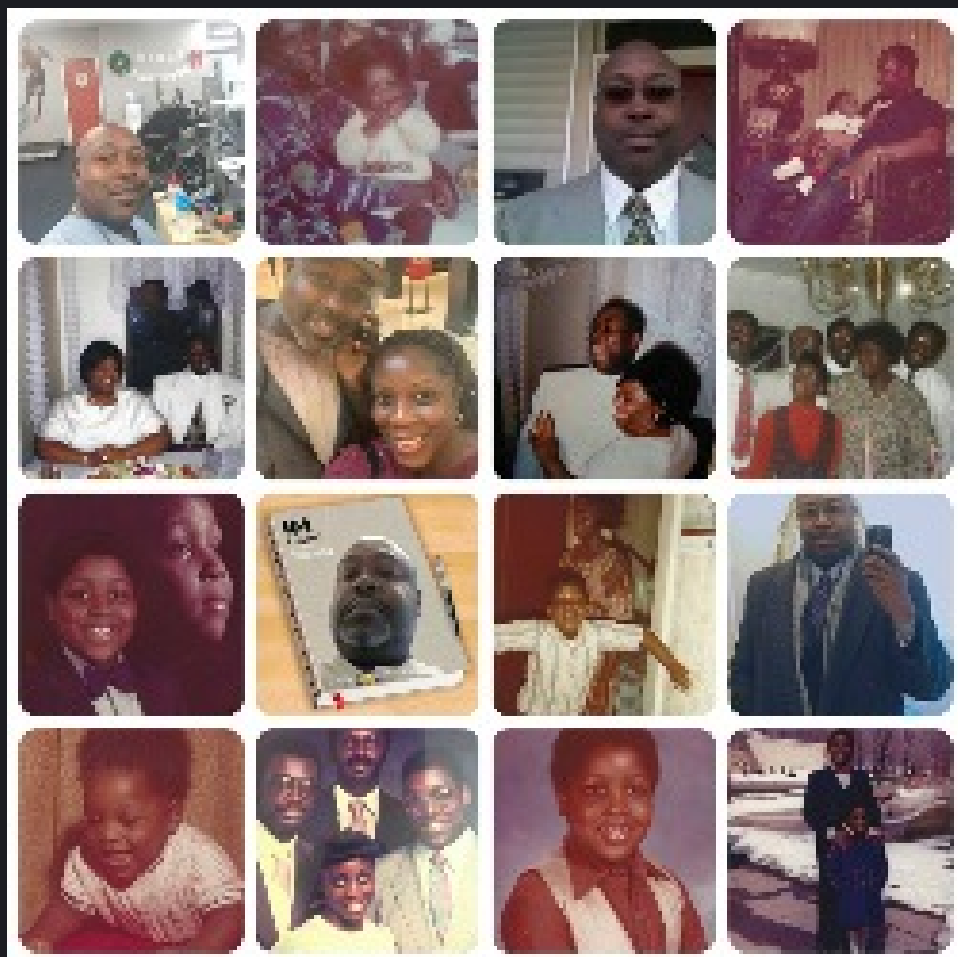
Tyrone will be dearly missed and loved by his family, friends, acquaintances, and the people he touched throughout his life.
