In 1972 Pamella gave birth to her first child, Nadine Johnson. She relocated to Kingston where she gained employment as a Technical Support Specialist and a restaurant employee.

In 1974 Pamella was successful in passing the Police Officers' examination, but she took advantage of the opportunity to migrate to the United States instead. She settled in Cincinnati, Ohio, where she enrolled in a Dental Hygienist program and worked as a waitress to pay her way through the program.

In 1979, Pamella moved to New York and enrolled in Wilfred Academy to study cosmetology. In addition, she pursued a career as a Certified Nurse's Aide (CNA) where she found great pleasure in helping people. She was able to utilize her nursing skills at the Westchester Medical and Burke Rehabilitation Centers respectively. In 1993, Pamela learned that she was going to be a grandmother, so she resigned from Burke Rehabilitation Center to pursue a career in Early Childhood education. After receiving her degree, Pamela opened a daycare center so that she could care for her grandson. She also cared for nieces, nephews and other children in the area. When her grandson was old enough to attend school, Pamela closed the daycare and devoted her time to being a full-time homemaker. She honed her skills as a gourmet chef and was among the best in preparing sumptuous dishes for her family and friends. Pamela also had a flair for fashion and will always be remembered for her elegant styles. In addition, she was a gifted interior decorator and gardener. Pamela was truly a lady of many talents.

Despite her successes, Pamela felt the need for God in her life, so she accepted the Lord as her personal savior and rekindled her love for church. She became an active member at her church where she served as Head Usher, choir member, and hospitality team member. Pamela was very instrumental in helping to build the church; the first service was held in her basement, and she managed the building projects at the church's current location in Mamaroneck. All who knew Pamela knew that she was a selfless person who put the needs of others above her own and deeply loved her family and friends.

Pamela succumbed to her illness on March 18, 2020.
