## **Obituary**

Chief Apostle Rebecca Brown, was born June 8, 1947 to the late Mr. Demis Hurt and Missionary Cora Nivens, in Brooklyn, New York. She departed this life at New York Community Hospital, Brooklyn, New York on Thursday, April 2, 2020.

Apostle Brown was educated in the New York school system. After graduating Girls High School, she worked in sales prior to her employment at Interfaith Medical Center where she served as a supervisor in the patient accounting department. While employed, she also led the "Noon Day Prayer Warriors", teaching other employees the word of God. After 38 years of diligent service at Interfaith, she retired and moved into full-time ministry.

At an early age, Apostle Brown accepted Christ as her personal Savior at a small holiness church in Keysville, Virginia. She was a long standing member of Institutional C.O.G.I.C., Brooklyn, New York. Under the tutelage of the late Bishop Carl E. Williams Sr., she was installed as pastor and founder of International Prayer Warriors Church, Inc. in 1996. As her hunger and thirst for God continually grew, she enrolled in New Greater Bethel Bible Institute where she obtained her Associates', Bachelors', and Masters' degrees in Theology.

In 2011, Apostle Brown was consecrated and elevated to the office of "Chief Apostle" of the International Prayer Warriors Church Fellowship Ministries. Most notably in 2012, she received he honorary Doctorate in Sacred Theology from the Shekinah Bible Institute & School of Ministry. She later founded and served as the president of the International Prayer Warriors Bible Institute & School of Ministry.

The Chief Apostle Rebecca Brown was a devoted mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, cousin, friend, and spiritual leader. She was an amazingly, bold woman; strong-willed; determined; and God-fearing. She was committed to leading God's people into their season of destiny. She was a "fireball" in the gospel; tirelessly praying, interceding, worshiping, and praising God. She will always be remembered for the praise that she gave God in the dance. Chief Apostle Rebecca Brown trusted in God through all things. For as many times as God used her to speak into the lives of others, she would always say, "To God be the glory, for the great things He has done".

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her sisters Pastor Carolyn Hester-White and Yvonne Mackey of Brooklyn, New York.
