Geraldine R Jenkins affectionately known as Gerri to all that knew and loved her was born to William and Lena Bouie Ragin in Newark NJ on October 11, 1926, the oldest of nine children.

Gerri graduated from West Side High School in 1945 a member of the yearbook staff and civics program. After high school she worked in Office of Dependency Benefits in Newark as a member of the finance dept, processing checks for families of the servicemen. Her work history stopped during the fifties when she became a mother to her only child Cheryl A Berry Williams and wife to Eugene Jenkins, who preceded her in death. From 1967 - 1978 she worked a brief stent as a long distance operator for the phone company. Gerri also worked for the United States Post Office as a mail handler/carrier and at times

a distribution clerk, and finishing as Intermittent Claims Taker for The New Jersey Unemployment Office in East Orange.

Gerri always knew she wanted to do more than what the era assigned to women so she began her journey to becoming a Social Worker and set off back to school. Pursuing a major in Mental Health Gerri received her Associates of Applied Science at Essex County College in May of 1981. She didn't stop there; while working as a Mental Health Aide for Catholic Community Services, Mt Carmel Guild from 1981-1985 she enrolled and graduated from Kean College receiving her Bachelors degree in Social Work in June of 1985. From there she participated in several internships and volunteer programs, way too many to list. Now rejoicing in achieving her new found career she began working at Easter Seal Society as a live-in Residential Counselor for mentally impaired adult. Later landing a job at Newark Preschool Council Inc (Head Start Program) as Social Worker where she happily worked until her retirement in 1991.

Now you can't talked about Geraldine and not know her spiritual linage which started at Saint Phillip Holy Church which she held dear to her heart and was fully involved in. Starting with bible studies, and missionary/leadership training under her mothers tutelage from the time she graduated high school until 1964. Geraldine became an Evangelist on June 28, 1978 receiving her training under the United Church of Jesus Christ in Washington D.C. She then started training to receive her Elder and Pastor Orders through Tabernacle Church of God in Newark in August of 1972 and took over as the pastor of St. Phillips Holy Church.

Geraldine then set her sights on becoming ordained which she received through The Original United Freewill Baptist Conference of America in November of 1974. Evangelist Jenkins ministerial experience is loaded with various theological conferences, seminars, and workshops throughout the years. She was a member of United Clergy of the Oranges under Rev. Michael Sykes, the Prevailing Prayer Band under Deacon John Jones, and the Essex County Prison Ministry for Essex County Jail Annex in Caldwell NJ.




