It is with heavy hearts that the family of **Lillian Jefferson** announces her passing on the morning of April 28, 2020, at the age of 83. Born to Richard and Sally Green in Charleston, South Carolina on February 11, 1937, Lillie began her spiritual journey at Emmanuel Methodist Church. As a teenager, she moved to New Jersey with her sister, Henrietta Thompson. Lillie graduated from Ferris High School in Jersey City. Shortly after, she wed Willie C. Gadson in 1956. Their union was blessed with eight children. Lillie worked as a housekeeper and full-time mother. She later worked as a caterer at Spice and Company with her beloved friend Juliet Wentworth. After becoming a widow, Lillie later remarried Wesley Jefferson in the summer of 1988. Her family continued to grow through the years.

Lillian had an undeniable passion and love for the church. It was during choir rehearsal in January of 1958, she was baptized and filled with the Holy Ghost. The first church she attended in Jersey City was New Hope Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of Rev. James N. Williams. She also attended the Cornerstone Church of Christ led by Bishop Grady Dale. Lillian then joined the Good Shepherd Church of Christ under the leadership of District Elder Walter Meadows; there she would become a cornerstone within the church. Throughout the years, Lillie was heavily involved in her congregation; she sang in the choir, was a devoted member of the usher board, and taught Sunday School. Lillie's dedication did not stop there, for many years she served as the Missionary President.

Lillian's service to the church did not go unnoticed. Elder Meadow called upon Lillie with a significant request. After seeking the Lord's guidance, he asked Lillie to consider replacing previous church Mother, Sallie Smith who was moving away. She was incredibly nervous about this decision and doubted her ability to fulfill his plea; she asked if he was sure. Elder Meadow explained that God had laid it on his heart to make her the church Mother. Although she was reluctant, he did not give up and offered to relieve her of some of her duties. With the understanding and confidence that God would not give her more than she could handle, Elder Meadow was able to convince Lillian to become the beloved church Mother.

After the Lord called Pastor Meadows home, Mother Jefferson continued to serve faithfully and dutifully as the church mother under the leadership of Pastor Bishop James Herron Sr. Her significant impact on the community was felt by the pastor, young congregants and church families.

Lillian will forever be remembered by those who loved her dearly. She was a devoted mother both to her children and her church, a loving grandmother, an amazing cook, and a classy dresser with a hat to match.
