Samuel William Barry Ragland, 95, departed this life on Wednesday, April 15, 2020 at 5:35am in Montefiore Hospital, Bronx, New York.

Samuel Ragland was born on July 8, 1924 in Mount Vernon, New York to the late Deacon Nathaniel B. Ragland, Sr. and Luealder Brown Ragland. He was the oldest of nine children. He attended Plainfield High School in Plainfield, New Jersey. He was preceded in death by his three brothers: Joseph, Bernard, and Nathaniel Ragland, Jr.; his sister, Mary Ragland Henson; his two sons, Scott Ragland and Samuel Ragland, Jr.; his daughter, Carolyn Ragland; and his grandson, Scott Ragland, Jr.

He worked in his father's pool room and candy store. During this time is when he was introduced to his love for gambling as he took numbers for his father from Plainfield to Jersey City. He then went on to driving trucks, became a manager for the popular retail chain of the 60s, 'Two Guys', and professionally gambled for many years in Harlem. He lived in Harlem for the rest of his days. He was beloved by many in the Harlem community.

Samuel attended Church at Church of God and Saint of Christ as a child. His father was a Deacon of the church as well. Although he did not belong to an organization as an adult, Samuel kept God close to his heart.
