**Edna Louise Riley (Armstrong)** passed peacefully, surrounded by family on May 9, 2020 in the home of her loving niece in the Bronx. She was born in Montgomery Alabama on November 8, 1937 to Edward Lowe and Beulah Lee Austin. As a young child, she was an excellent student and a strong-willed, yet loving individual.

Her family relocated to Akron OH in 1947; however, upon the untimely death of her mother in 1953, New York City became Edna's permanent home. During her high school years, she was fortunate to land a clerical job with the Federal Government that enabled her to complete her educational requirements during the evening and to graduate from Roosevelt High School in 1956.

She met, fell in love and married the late Fred Riley. As a young widow and single parent, her integrity and strong work ethic led to a career path within State and Local Government. Edna enjoyed traveling to visit family, abroad, bus outings to Atlantic City and social activities. She loved to dance, was a phenomenal speaker and demonstrated extraordinary writing skills.

A devout Christian, Edna spent her lifetime in formal bible study and education. In 1985, she joined Thessalonia Baptist Church and served in various ministries and administrative positions. She faithfully attended services there until her health began to fail a few years ago. After dating long-time friend James "Stone" Armstrong for 20 years, they were married on February 22, 1986. The combining of their families provided her with the love and blessings of additional children.

Edna retired from the New York City Office of Contract Management in 1992. As a Deputy Director, her department reformed the city's welfare system in the Bronx. In addition, she was able to positively impact many lives through her work with the Agency for Child Development, the nation's largest contracting agency that funded day care centers nationwide. After 40 years of employment, Edna remained engaged in her field through active involvement in the Retirees Association. She had a cadre of associates "The Over the Hill Gang" who remained loyal friends in retirement.

Edna was preceded in death by siblings Esther Riley and Alonzo Street and husband Stone on July 18, 2019.
