Herman Williams was born in Richmond, VA on October 22, 1923 son of James and Susie Jefferson Williams. He left home at the approximate age of 15 and migrated up north to New York City.

Herman was a member of Shiloh Church of Christ in Harlem NYC and House of Mercy Inc. in Elizabeth, NJ, where he served faithfully as Deacon for decades under Elder John H. Gray and Pastor Barry Shumate respectively. He loved the Lord strongly and showed his spirit often during services.

Herman loved to do projects around the house and enjoy his backyard. He loved family gatherings like the holidays, getting on the grill, watching his grandchildren have fun or any reason he could have his family around where he could have a laugh or two. He worked a long hard life and produced much as he provided well for his family living in two homes. One in Jamaica Queens, NY and lastly in Linden, NJ where he passed away on May 12, 2020 at the full ripe age of 97.


