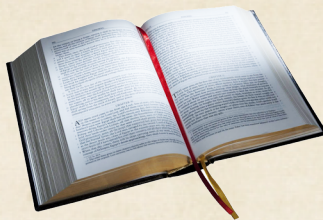

Obituary


