

Obituary

Nelson Dacosta Moxam was born on October 4th 1943, in Treasure Beach, St. Elizabeth in the island of Jamaica to the late Bertie Moxam and Olga Moxam. He was the third of 10 children. Emilo, Ruben, Bettie, Christopher, Blossom, Jenny, Rema, Joyce, and Kelvin. Ruben, Rema, and Kelvin all preceded him.

He was affectionately called “ Nelly” by his wife and family, “ Laads” by his friends. Growing up in his community Nelson had a close bond with his siblings. This bond transcended to his friends as he developed a love for playing cricket. He developed into a crafty fast bowler for a team in his community.

As a teenager Nelson had his eyes set on the love of his life Joan (Shine).

He quickly realized he had to start planning for the future. After graduating Sandy Bank Primary “ Laads” began earning an income as a conductor. Shortly after he was hired as an electrician at Alpart. He later transferred to the Rivere Bauxite company. Laads was admired and liked by all his peers.

His eyes were always on Shine, thus by extension Nelson was always on her mind. After a few years of courtship Nelson was convinced he had met the Love of his life Joan. On December 15th 1968 they were joined in holy Matrimony (“Forever mine”). Nelson with his inquiring mind became an entrepreneur and started selling fish in his home Parish, he went as far as ST James and Clarendon.

In 1978 he migrated to the United States where he renewed his passion as an electrician. The following year his wife followed. They worked hard to set a foundation for their family. The bond between Nelson and Joan produced two fine sons Andre & Matthew. There are three grandchildren Andre, Kayla, Arion, and daughter in law Monique. Among his many accomplishments his most cherished was that of a husband, father, grandfather, brother ,brother in law, uncle, and friend.
