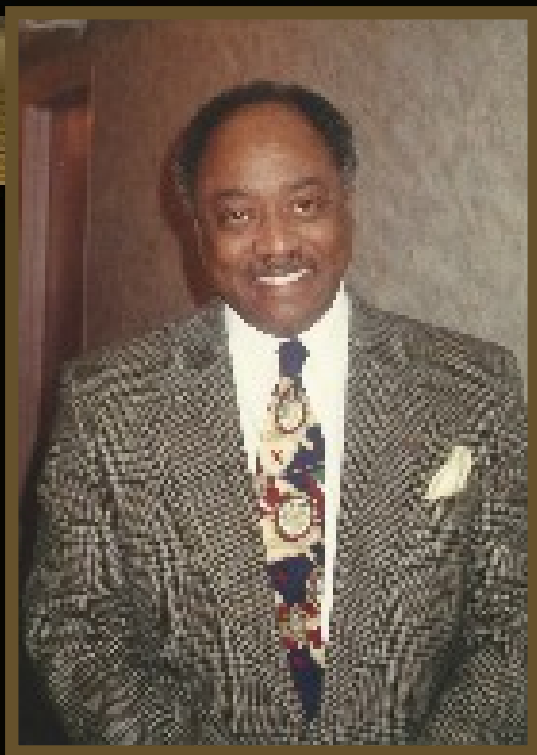

Obituary

David G. Bond was born in Windsor, North Carolina, on November 20, 1940 to James H. and Ruth Epps Bond. He has one sister, Ruth Bond-Cherry. He was married to Dorothy Paige Smith. They have one daughter, Paige Cherie Bond.

David received his BA Degree in Sociology from North Carolina Central University in 1962. He received the MSW Degree from Adelphi University School of Social Work in 1970, the MPA Degree from New York University School of Public Administration in 1973 and was a doctoral candidate in Public Administration. He was a doctoral candidate in the School of Social Work at Adelphi University in 1990. He also attended Summer Institutes at Fordham University School of Social Work in Administrative and Agency Operations. He was a Licensed Master of Social Work.

As Founder of Community Action for Human Services, Inc., he was the President/Chief Executive Officer from 1982 - 2013. Prior to founding Community Action for Human Services, Inc., he was Executive Director of Young Adult Institute from 1971 - 1979; Program Director of Young Adult Institute, 1970 - 1971; Director of New York Urban Affairs Office, New York State Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities; Social Work Intern at Brookdale Childcare, 1968 - 1979; Social Worker at New York City Youth Council Bureau, 1965 - 1968; and Psychiatric Social Worker at Kings Parks State Hospital, 1962 - 1965.

David served as Vice President of the North Carolina Central University Alumni Association in New York from 1965 - 1973 and has been a member since. He is the Founder/Sponsor of the Trudi Ann Bond Scholarship Endowment Fund at North Carolina Central University.
