# Obituary

**Pastor Roy Keith Williams** was born in Manchester, Jamaica to Imogene Benloss. He attended Grove Town School in Manchester, Jamaica. He was baptized at the tender age of 12 and it was said that he delivered such an inspiring testimony that his cousin gave him the name of “Bishop”.

Dad would often times tell us that his best friends were his cousins Eric and Dee Benloss. His first job was working for a Doctor’s Office as a Laborer, dad would say this job was backbreaking but continued in this role until something else bigger and better came along. He migrated to England in the 60’s and was welcomed by a family friend named King. He worked hard and attended church, work and college (Brixton College). He met his wife Lilieth at church, Hetherington Road, Pentecostal Church, London. The pair fell in love and started to court. On May 25, 1963 they were married at Stockwell Baptist Church, and out of this union, they went on to have four wonderful children.

He instilled in his children that they should get a good education and learn to stand on their own two feet to support themselves. Exodus 20:12 “Honor your **father** and your **mother**, so that you may live long in the land the Lord thy God giveth thee”.

Whilst living in England dad worked at Ford's Car Manufacturers for a number of years before leaving for the States. On arrival in the states Dad sorted himself out with a place to live and went about gaining employment at Holy Comfort Nursing Home before retiring. Dad would welcome friends from England with open arms and always made everyone feel welcome picking them up from the airport and taking them back. Dad carried on doing things that he could do until his health started to decline over the last several years. My siblings were with him and I would visit as much as I could as well as to call and check to make sure he was doing well and in good spirit.

Pastor Williams and his late wife Sister Lilieth Williams pastored a Church in Battersea, London, England for many years before migrating to the United States on July 23, 1989.

Pastor Williams (Dad) was God fearing, caring, strict disciplinarian, loved to read his bible and made sure that he cared and provided for his family. Dad's personality was quiet, always reflecting on things.

Pastor Williams was preceded in death by his wife Lilieth Williams, whom he loved and cherished dearly, likewise his mother Imogene Benloss.

He leaves behind his children, Janet, Annette, Paul and Patrick. “Hold onto the cherished memories which are irreplaceable.” Son-in-Law, Daughters-in-law, Grandchildren, Dejeun, Darnell, Mercedes and Kelis, Great Granddaughter Storm and Brother Nathaniel Harrison, and a host of cousins, and extended family and friends.
