Obituary

Hazel “Chinnie” Hubbard was born on June 30, 1932 to Roscoe and Gladys Wilson in Newark, NJ.

Chinnie was raised on Lillie Street in Newark, the 3rd of 4 Daughters. She attended Cleveland Ave. Elementary School, West Kinney Junior High, and South Side High School. Due to a serious illness as a teen, she was unable to graduate. Soon after her recovery in 1953, while on a trip to Philadelphia, PA, she met Sergeant John Hubbard. John, on leave from his station in Wurzburg, Germany, and headed home to Philly, immediately became smitten with her. So much so that the next week he made her his wife before returning to Germany the following week. A few months later, she joined him in Germany and they began their married life. During their marriage, they welcomed a Daughter Regina in 1955. After returning from the war, they settled in NJ but separated some years later.

Through the years, Chinnie continued to thrive and prosper in her church Greater Harvest Baptist Church. She strived as a single parent with determination, strength, and much love. She and Regina moved to FDR Homes (now Terrell Homes) in the Ironbound Section of Newark in 1962. She was an active member of the Tenant’s Association, and lived in that community for over 40 years.

She worked for many years for the Newark Board of Education. She started her career there as a Custodian at Hudson St. School and eventually became a Bus Attendant for the school system working primarily with challenged and disabled students. “Ms. Hazel” was loved by her co-workers, but especially the students and parents she serviced during her tenure. She worked for the Board until her retirement. In addition, she worked for the Essex County Elections Board manning the Polls for many years at Hawkins Street School in the Ironbound.

She is preceded in Death by her Mom, Gladys (Norris) Wilson, Dad, Roscoe Wilson, Sisters, Ruby (Norris) Miller and Nadine (Wilson) Moore, niece, Lavante Thornton.

Chinnie is survived by her Daughter, Regina Hubbard-Johnson (late Danny Johnson), Granddaughter Roscelle Hubbard, Sister Helen Thornton, Great Grandchildren Leilani, Amare’, and Zion, Nephews Marcus Thornton and Gore Moore; and a host of other cherished relatives and friends.
