



He is predeceased by his beloved wife, Martha Green whom he had a collaborative and caring relationship with. Their relationship was based on mutual support and a deep respect for each other. He is survived by his first wife, Yvonne Green, his five children, Guiselle Green, Delroy Green, Ivonne Green, Kattya Green and Michele Green. Maribeth Green, the eldest daughter preceded him in death in 2015. He leaves seven grandchildren, Fred Brissett, Jamal Brissett, Natassia Brissett, Calvin Johnson, Michael Brissett, Daijane Green, Chad Wilkinson-Green and Jahdé Brissett his great granddaughter.


Papá was interned at Mount Rest Cemetery, Butler, New Jersey on April 29, 2020.
