Reflections of Life for William James Massie Jr. Aka "The Funk Master #1"

William Massie was born on October 18, 1958 in Bronx, New York. He was the son of the late William J. Massie Sr. and Lola M. Massie. "Billy," lovingly named by his family, grew up on Myrtle Avenue in Jersey City, New Jersey, he attended Sacred Heart School, and Henry S. Snyder High School, both in Jersey City.

William Jr. was very musically inclined. He learned to play the bass guitar at the tender age of four. This was due to his father, William Massie Sr.'s eye for spotting gifted and talents musicians. It was Bill's father who taught him how to play the bass guitar. His love and passion for playing the bass grew over the years, as he readily shared his love of music with everyone he met. In his teenage years, he played in the Henry S. Snyder High School Jazz Band, and as well as improving his talents by practicing with some of Jersey City's most talented musicians. Many of the musicians he played with, were managed by his father. At sixteen years of age, he was sought after by the famed group, Kool and the Gang, but was too young to travel. Since education was most important to his parents, they wanted him to continue his education and graduate high school. However, after graduating high School, Bill decided to leave home and take the music world by storm!

Bill loved to laugh and just have fun! In his younger years, he would watch Saturday morning cartoons with his sisters, Carmelita and Cellestine. He would play Charlie Brown Christmas Dance and the Pink Panther Theme song on his bass guitar, while they laughed and danced. After high school, Bill moved to Canada for two years, and lived in California for one year because he experienced living through an earthquake! Bill returned home in 1983, after touring for many years. His two younger sisters weren't deprived of his phenomenal music abilities either. Vonisha and Angyl along with his other sisters and brothers- in- law played in the Christ Memorial Christian Faith Ministries choir for five years under the leadership of the late Bishop Edward L. Hackett and continued to play locally.

Following the footsteps of his Dad, Bill began a career in Trucking, Bill's trucking career included working for companies such as John Sexton Foods, Englewood, New Jersey, Fleetwood Forwarding, Kearny, New Jersey, and Fedway Associates Incorporated, Elizabeth, New Jersey.

Bill had a huge heart and an infectious smile! He never met a stranger and would help everyone that he could. Bill's friends loved him very much! His friends Mike, Agnus, and Terry were very special to him. They often hung out together and shared many aspects of their lives! To Bill, they were the brother's that he never had, and Agnus was just like a sister to him. Two years prior to his passing, Bill began a loving relationship with his girlfriend, Ms. Dorothy Mentor. Dorothy was his devoted friend and stayed by his side until his death.
