Lunie P. Kendrick was born on October 26, 1923 in Lincolnton, GA to the late Tummie and Frances Norman.

Luna Pearl / Ms. K. as she was affectionately called by family and friends, received her primary education in the schools of Lincolnton until family responsibilities were thrust upon her at a young age.

At an early age she professed her faith in Jesus Christ and became a member of the New Tabernacle Baptist Church in Lincolnton, GA. While in Lincolnton, she met and married her Husband of Fifty-Two (52) years, Sim (Pete) Kendrick. Lunie relocated to New Jersey, first to Lodi, and than later to Passaic where she resided until 1985. Never forgetting her early Christian training, upon moving to New Jersey she united with the Calvary Baptist Church of Garfield, NJ. Lunie enjoyed traveling back and forth to her dual residences, she spent summers on the East Coast with her daughter Linda and son-in-law Clayton and winters on the west coast with daughters Jeanetta and Romenia. Lunie attended the famous historical March on Washington in 1963 where Dr. Martin Luther King gave his "I HAVE A DREAM" speech.
