ZUNITA BEVERLY JORDAN, oldest daughter of the late Zunita and William "Sonny" Jordan, was born August 20, 1948 in Lincoln Hospital Bronx, New York.

Zunita worked many jobs before starting a career at the United States Postal Service. She devoted 17 years of her service before retiring in 2002.

Throughout her life she adored her husband of 56 years and nurtured her family. Zunita Beverly Jordan Lowrance lived a prolific life and achieved many accolades that have become her legacy.
