On Wednesday, July 15, 2020, she entered into eternal rest. Jean was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend.

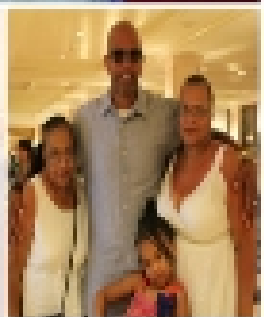
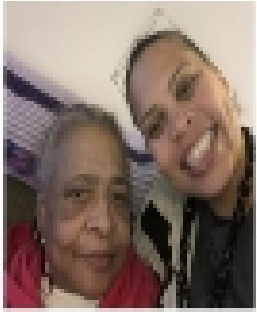
