On June 26, 1970 Ajibayo entered the world as a ray of light that would shine on all who came to know him. He was one of the dedicated and most charismatic sons of Ibugbeola Comfort and Samuel Robert Akinmuko.

Ajibobo spent the greatest part of his early life in his native home of Ondo State, Nigeria where he did his early schooling in St. Andrew's Primary school and Ondo Boys High school. He later pursued higher education at the University of Calabar where he graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Zoology.

He came to know Christ as a youth and was reborn at Redeemed Christian Church of God.

Upon graduation, Ajibayo entered the family business of automobile sales and excelled initially working with his brother at the car shop in Ojota which due to Jibayo's friendly nature and disposition became a meeting point of his friend with Asun, drinks and games of draughts always on the go.

Ajii would later set out on his own, engaging mainly in automobile business and also some general supplies. Aji-Father became a "go to" person for most of his friends and associates who needed to buy cars and he will be remembered for his fairness in business and his knack of always going the extra mile to ensure his customers were satisfied including personally driving newly bought and unregistered cars to places like Ondo, Ile-Oluji, Akure etc. just to satisfy his customers.

Over 35 years ago he committed his love and heart to Mrs. Omuwnmi Akinmuko "nee Adesegha" the mother of their twin children, daughter Iremide Zelda Akinmuko and son Ayomikun Henry William Akinmuko. Ajibayo married Mrs. Omowunmi the love of his life in a colorful ceremony in 18th of December 2010 and relocated to be with her in America in 2016.

Upon arriving in America, Ajibayo continued his business interests in automobiles and was also a dedicated and valued employee of Summit Security Service, Inc and Westchester Government County office. In America Jibayo continued his commitment as a humble servant to Christ at Redeemed Christian Church in Bronx, NY.

Ajibayo enjoyed an active social life supporting his friends and associates socially as required. He had a wide circle of friends who knew him to be Humble, friendly, always smiling and very slow to anger. He was a devoted member of Prudential Family Club in Ondo. 
