Emma Murphy was born on January 26, 1941 to Fannie Griffin and Cleophas Sullivan Sr. in Clarks Hill, South Carolina. She was the fourth child of eleven children. She was married to the late Peter Murphy of Whiteville, North Carolina.

Emma received her education in the Jersey City Public School System. She began her education at Public School #22, and graduated from James J. Ferris High School. She furthered her education by taking post graduate courses offered at Dickinson High School.

Emma had an extensive working career. During the period from August 1959 to 1968 she was employed at TOPS, a stationary firm on Tonnele Avenue in Jersey City, then moved with Manco Watch Manufacturing. In 1968, Emma gained employment at what we now know as Blue Cross Blue Shield of New York. Over the 30-year span of working for this company, her work included medical records, compiler of insurance rates and fees, training of staff personnel, processing claims, staff management and procedures, and divisional review and reports of patients. She became the Division Manager's Assistant and completed her tenure on May 14, 1998.

Emma was always goal oriented and wanted to make sure that her parents and family were proud of her. Whether in school or on her job, Emma excelled at whatever she did and distinguished herself as reliable and efficient. In the Sullivan/Murphy family Emma was seen as a leader, that person you can depend on and one who always strived for the best.

Emma was a confirmed member of Monumental Baptist Church for over 20 years and a faithful servant. She served as a member of the Soup Kitchen, the Dorcas Room Ministries, the Chapel Choir and the Mother's Circle. She was also a Den Leader of the Boy Scouts

Emma also understood the importance of service within the community. She dedicated many hours to the Shared Food Program where she assisted in feeding the homeless and providing encouraging words of hope. Although she was not well at times, she persevered and brought meals to the homeless community in Journal Square during evening hours. She had a heart of compassion and her kindness to the community is a great example of brotherly love.

Emma was also a member of the Order of the Most Worthy Masonic Architect of the Universe Grand Lodge where she held the positions of Financial Officer and Chapter Secretary.

Some say sometimes God picks the flower that is still in full bloom. On July 23, 2020, God called his flower, Emma home from her faithful service. Emma will be greatly missed and cherished by her five siblings-Lula Young, Margie Moore, Mattie Pearl Nicholson and Ronald Sullivan (Karen) all of New Jersey and Cleophas Sullivan (Cynthia) of Burke, Virginia. Emma holds a special place in the hearts of her extended family and friends, including 16 nieces and nephews, 26 great nieces and nephews as well as many cousins. Emma was predeceased by her parents, Cleophas and Fannie Griffin Sullivan, three brothers, Curtis, William and Howard Sullivan and two sisters, Nell Fields and Patricia Sullivan Hunter.


I'm There Inside Your Heart
