Although they had these challenges, Vernelle treated them as though they didn't have a care in the world. All through life, Vernelle was loved by all who knew her. She loved to shop, laugh, dance and have fun with her family and friends. Vernelle was a "FASHIONISTA!" Vernelle also was a gifted artist who loved to draw.

On Monday, May 31, 1976 in Swan Lake New York, Vernelle married the love of her life William Lee Booker from this union three children were born, Lee William, Victoria Mazie and Andrenkia Mellissann; her children was her biggest accomplishment and she loved them like no one else could not treating one better than the other. She taught her children to be respectful, treat others as they want to be treated and the value of education. She prepared them for life as an adult. All of her valuable lessons did not prepare them for this moment.
