From his love and dedication other churches networked and established the necessary connections that enabled him to bring forth access to services such as mental health certification classes, health screenings, clothing donations, and even guidance on financial and housing needs. He was able to connect with other food pantries and take trips to the farms to learn more about where their food was coming from.

David passion, led him to assist the New York City Department of Education with starting a Special Needs Advocacy training program. The training helped equip the youths in the program with hands-on training to prepare them for future endeavors.

David received an Accolade of Awards for his commitment and dedication in serving the community.

1 SAMUEL 16; 13(NIV)


