### <u>Obituary</u>

Walter Anderson Taylor, Jr. was born on August 16, 1941 in Newark, NJ to the late Walter and Viola Taylor. The eldest of three sons, he was educated in the Newark Public school system and attended East Side High School, where he participated on the cross-country and track and field teams. After completing his education, Walter enlisted in the US Air-force to embark on a life of service to his country and to travel the world. It was a proud moment for the family as he followed in his father's footsteps, Walter Taylor Sr. who served in the US Army and fought in World War II. In October 1962, while stationed in Miami Dade County, on the Homestead Air Force Base, Walter and his fellow airmen found themselves on the brink of war during the Cuban Missile Crisis, a pivotal turning point during the Cold War. A tent city of more than 10,000 Army troops was set up, and the Army and Air Force were readied to respond to the growing Communist threat from Cuba while America held its breath. Upon its conclusion, President John F. Kennedy paid Homestead Air Force Base a visit to inspect its preparation and the troops whose courage and dedication to democracy will go down in history.

In 1963 Walter received an honorable discharge and returned to the City of his birth, desiring to be close to his family and begin a career in the tool and die industry. He was a hard diligent worker until he retired in More than anything, Walter loved family, staying close to home and living out his days in the ease with which he looked forward to.

He leaves to cherish loving memories: his brothers, Paul (Carol) and Philip (Mikki); Nephews Raheem (Andrea) and Philip Jr., Nieces Samantha and Ashley, a host of cousins, great nephews and nieces and friends.
