Hesroni was born on the beautiful island of Carriacou, Grenada on January 23, 1972.

While residing in Grenada, Hesroni attended Dover Model School & Hillsborough Secondary School. From a very young age, it was evident that Roni was skilled with his hands. He would sculpt wooden sail boats, spinning tops, make cricket bats and fashion kites for flight on Easter Sunday.
