She loved wearing Ugg boots in the winter. Another one of Destiny’s favorites was Halloween. Her and Alex would get costumes every year. Last year me and Star went to get her costume, she was a Princess for Halloween and she loved it. Every year we would go Trick or Treating and they loved it. They would receive lots of candy, and some Halloweens we would go to church with Destiny’s godmother Robin. She also went on a vacation to Disney World, where her and Alex enjoyed themselves.

Destiny loved Oodles and Noodles, Captain Crunch Cereal, Oreo Cookies, but her favorite was Noodles. She also loved going to the movies with her dad, playing video games with her nephew, Alex (known to her as her brother). She loved spending time with her baby sister, Skye. Destiny loved to laugh. My friend Star (known as my sister) would call her “Giggles” because when they got around each other, Destiny would giggle all the time. And I would say, “what’s so funny” and she would just start laughing.

Destiny was a loved child and everyone loved her. She was very respectful and had a beautiful soul. She loved wearing her hoodie sweater that she always got in trouble for wearing in school. Ms. Robinson would always have to call me. Destiny would give her a time with that sweater and that iPhone (LOL), but Ms. Robinson loved Destiny. And would always stick up for her.
