Reggie was a fantastic Basketball Coach. He was responsible for sending several youth to Higher Education Institutions. One of Reggie's pupils went on to play Professional Basketball for the WNBA. Reggie served as the Head Coach for Men's Junior Varsity Basketball Team and Head coach for the Women's Varsity Basketball Team at the College of Staten Island. He also served as the Assistant Coach of the Men's Varsity Basketball Team at CCNY.
