Lewis worked as an Election Inspector for New York State Board of Elections and remained a Custodian for his residency.

Lewis' passion was to serve the works and body of Jesus Christ. Always remaining selfless in helping and encouraging many others as he could to be steadfast, focused, and totally trusting his lord, Jesus Christ. Lewis would always say in his own words, "We do not know the day or the hour, our life is in God's hands, that is why God said boast, not of tomorrow, but we ought to say if the lord will. God is a sovereign God."

Lewis was the greatest story teller and wherever he went, he would greet you with his genuine smile, give a word of encouragement, he was honest in his integrity, and gave a helping hand to many and always had a story to share. Lewis disciplined his children when needed and planted seeds of greatness in them that would always make them think/reflect on their situations and choose to do right in making the appropriate decisions in life. He encouraged many and was successful in turning their life to Jesus Christ always leading by example. Lewis attended God's Battalion of Prayer Church in Brooklyn, New York. He was happy and privileged to serve in Royal Rangers Boy Scouts as a leader ministering to our youths. Lewis was a part of the Men's Ministry, Men's Choir, the food pantry, ushered, helped maintain cleanliness in the church building, and attended prison ministries. He enjoyed being a witness for Jesus and spreading the fragrance of Christ to many behind prison walls. He was always ready, willing, and able to serve in every way as a representative and soldier of God's love, Jesus Christ.

His legacy lives on through: his wife, Lorraine Ashley; his children, Ezra, Philip, Rebekah, Joshua (deceased), David and Laurelle Ashley; his eight grandchildren, Christopher, Destinee, Gabriela, Caden, Gabriel, Zachariah, Zemirah and King; his mother, Stella Macintosh Ashley; siblings, Barbara, Jennifer, Oswald, Cheryl and Andrea; and a host of nieces, nephews, great-nephews, cousins, extended family, and friends.

Let's celebrate his graduation as he earned his crown jewel in heaven. This earthly body is a temporary vessel, but the soul lives on. God Jesus Christ is the only way. Let's continue Lewis' legacy in encouraging many to be led to Christ so that we can also follow his example in graduating into eternity in heaven, where we will also have our crown waiting for us.
